



Caring for your vinyl banners

CLEANING

We recommend that you clean your banner after every use. You can use a mild spray cleaner such as 409 and some paper towels.

STORAGE

After cleaning your banner, roll the banner onto the tube lettering side out. Place the banner back into its plastic bag and store it in its shipping box. Do not store in extremely warm places. For best results store banners standing upright in a closet or storeroom at temperatures ranging from 50° F to 85° F. Never fold your banner or roll it without its tube, this can cause permanent creases.

HOT BANNERS

If you use your banner in a hot environment, the banner may be warm or even hot to the touch when you take it down. This is the time when your banner is the most fragile. Handle it gently, and try not to get creases in it. If at all possible lay your banner in the shade for 15-30 minutes before rolling it onto the tube. Remember to roll your banner with the vinyl lettering out.

INSTALLATION

It is always best to install your banner using as many fastening points as possible. If the banner is to be suspended, it is best to use at least six to eight grommets to keep your banner taut and to evenly distribute stress from wind. If the site for your banner will only permit attaching the banner from the corners, we recommend using banners with sewn in webbing and d-rings.

WIND HOLES

Wind holes should be used to reduce surface drag. It is always best to order your banner with wind holes already cut. If you are going to cut wind holes in a banner, always use a hole punch to cut a small hole at the ends of your wind hole. These punched holes will help to keep the wind hole from ripping out.
